


THE THURSDAY CLUB NATTER

As we are in tier four the Hub will have to remain closed.

Here is an email sent by the Head of Primary Care for South Warwickshire. This gives more details about the distribution of vaccines. The Wootton 'Local' Mass Immunisation site looks to be at Studley Village Hall but currently people are being sent to a wide range of Centres. *see below:*

"Across Coventry and Warwickshire all 3 Acute Hospitals are now vaccinating the priority cohorts as advised by the Joint Committee of Vaccinations and Immunisations.

University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire are using the Pfizer vaccine and George Eliot and South Warwickshire Foundation Trust are using the Oxford Astra Zeneca vaccine.

Across South Warwickshire in terms of primary care we also have 5 Local vaccination Sites (LVS) up and running with the 2 final LVS coming on line next week subject to National approval. These primary care LVS are currently receiving the Pfizer and the Oxford Astra Zeneca vaccine.

These 7 sites will be focussing on delivering one dose of the vaccine to the top 3 national JCVI (Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation) priority cohorts. These cohorts are:

1. Care Home residents and staff
2. Over 80's and all frontline health and social care staff
3. Over 75s.

The characteristics of the Pfizer vaccine makes is difficult to transport and handle and comes in packs of 975 vaccines. These HAVE to be administered within 86 to 99 hours of receipt.

The Oxford Astra Zeneca vaccine is much easier to store and transport and is therefore being used to vaccinate care home residents initially.

As the largest vaccination programme ever delivered by the NHS I am sure you can imagine the logistics are challenging and this, together with changing National guidance has meant that appointments have had to be issued in batches and at times cancelled or rescheduled. We of course apologise for this but sadly it is inevitable.

Can I ask you to remind your friends, neighbours, colleagues and patients groups that it would be really helpful if they waited to be called by their GP practice and not to contact their practice unless they require medical assistance.

Can I also ask you to reinforce the message that the NHS (and NHSEngland) will NEVER ask for any bank details to secure an appointment or vaccination - sadly just as the vaccination programme is expanding so too are the scams.




